THE TERRITORY OF CERTAIN COUNTRIES TO ENTER THE INDONESIAN

TERRITORY TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF THE NEW VARIANTOF COVID-19

B.1.1.529

1. Background

Observing the dynamics of the development of the new variant of COVID-19 B.1.1.529 in various territory abroad, it is necessary to issue a Circular Letter of the Director General of Immigration regardingTemporary Restrictions on Foreigners Who Have Lived and/or Visited the Territory of Certain Countries to Enter Indonesian Territory to Prevent the Spread of theNew Variant of COVID-19 B.1.1.529.

Whereasthe Circular Letter of the Director General of Immigration Number IMI-0269.GR.01.01 of 2021 regardingTemporary Restrictions on Foreigners Who Have Lived and/or Visited the Territory of Certain Countries to Enter the Indonesian Territory to Prevent the Spread of the New Variant of Covid-19 B.1.1.529 which has been amended by Circular Letter Number IMI-0270.GR.01.01 of 2021 regardingAmendments to Circular Letter of the Director General of Immigration Number IMI-0269.GR.01.01 of 2021 regardingTemporary Restrictions on Foreigners Who Have Lived and/or Visited the Territory of Certain Countries



to Enter the Territory of Indonesia to Prevent the Spread of the New Variant of Covid-19 B.1.1.529, it is no longer in accordance with the development of government policies, hence needs to be revoked.

2. Purpose and Objective

- a. The purpose of this circular letter is to implement stricter health protocols in the context of preventing the spread of the new variant of Covid-19 B.1.1.529
- b. The objective of this circular letter is to improve health protocols in preventing imported cases of the new variant of Covid-19 B.1.1.529.

3. Scope

The scope of this circular letter is to optimize the immigration function in supporting the government's efforts to prevent the spread of the new variant of Covid-19 B.1.1.529 in the Indonesian territory.

4. Legal Basis

- d. Regulation of The Minister of Law and Human Rights Number 44 of 2015 regardingThe Procedure for Checking Entry and Exit from Indonesian Territory at Immigration Checkpoints;
- Regulation of The Minister of Law and Human Rights Number34 of 2021 regardingThe Granting of Immigration Visa and Stay Permits During The Period of Handling The Corona Virus Disease 2019 and National Economic Recovery;
- f. Regulation of The Minister of Law and Human Rights Number 41 of 2021
 regardingOrganization and Work Procedure of the Ministry of Law and Human Rights;

5. Contents of the Circular Letter

- a. Attache / Immigration Technical Staff / Foreign Service Officer, Head of Immigration
 Division, Head of Immigration Office, and Head of Immigration Detention Center:
 Disseminate information to stakeholders and the public regarding:
 - Temporary refusal to enter the Indonesian territory for foreigners who have lived and/or visited South Africa, Botswana, Norway, Angola, Zambia, Zimbabwe, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, Eswatini, Lesotho, England, and Denmark within a period of 14 (fourteen) days before entering the territory of Indonesia;
 - 2) Temporary suspension of granting visitorvisas and limited stay visas for citizens of South Africa, Botswana, Norway, Angola, Zambia, Zimbabwe, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, Eswatini, Lesotho, United Kingdom and Denmark;
 - 3) The provisions as referred to in number 1) and number 2) are excluded for foreigners who will attend meetings related to the Indonesian Presidency in the G20.
- b. Head of Immigration Office in charge of Immigration Checkpoints:
 - Temporarily refuse entry to foreigners who have lived and/or visited the territories of South Africa, Botswana, Norway, Angola, Zambia, Zimbabwe, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, Eswatini, Lesotho, United Kingdom and Denmark within the previous 14 (fourteen) days to enter the territory of Indonesia;
 - 2) The provisions as referred to in number 1) are excluded for foreigners who will attend meetings related to the Indonesian Presidency in the G20.

6. Closing

a. With the stipulation of this circular letter, the Circular Letter of the Director General of Immigration Number IMI-0269.GR.01.01 of 2021 regardingTemporary Restrictions on Foreigners Who Have Lived and/or Visited the Territory of Certain Countries to Enter the Indonesian Territory to Prevent the Spread of the New Variant of Covid-19 B.1.1.529 which has been amended by Circular Letter Number IMI-0270.GR.01.01 of 2021 regardingAmendments to Circular Letter of the Director General of Immigration Number IMI-0269.GR.01.01 of 2021 regardingTemporary Restrictions on Foreigners Who Have Lived and/or Visited the Territory of Certain Countries to Enter the Territory of Indonesia to Prevent the Spread of the New Variant of Covid-19 B.1.1.529 is revoked and declared invalid;



b. This circular letter shall be effective as of December 29,2021 and will be evaluated further.
